

**These are the minor requirements as of AY '14. They apply to all students who entered the NAS program as of the 2013-'14 school year or after**

The interdisciplinary minor in Native American Studies requires a minimum of **28 credits, with at least 16 upper-division credits**. Students must fulfill distribution requirements, taking at least one class each from the following groups:

- Group I: Culture, Language & Education
- Group II: Law, Policy, Governance, & History
- Group III: Literature, Media & the Arts

One class counting toward the minor must be focused on **\*Oregon Indians**
