Description

The goal of the Tsunami Zone Web-based English Language Teaching Materials Project is to serve secondary level Thai teachers who work in the 4 provinces damaged by the 2004 Sumatra-Andaman Earthquake Tsunami. This course offers training and free copyable materials for teaching in English, using tsunamis and other related disasters as a focus for content.

The Tsunami Zone materials are based on a communicative, integrated skills approach with activities to support the development of reading, writing, speaking and listening skills for low-proficiency English language learners. The materials incorporate critical thinking skills, encouraging learners to develop and use problem-solving strategies and creativity in their learning tasks. Activities also vary in style in order to create opportunities for learning at different levels and with different learning styles.

Course Objectives

- Using the content and activities in this course, English teachers will work with science teachers to develop specific ways to use tsunami- and other disaster-related content in their own settings.
- Course participants will use online discussion forums to share ideas each week.
- Participants will improve their English language skills, particularly reading and writing, by interacting with the course instructor and each other in English in discussion forums.
- Starting in Week 6, participants will create and add to an e-portfolio with the work that they do during the course.

Course Expectations

Participants will contribute to the discussion with at least two posts each week.

Participants will participate in weekly tasks (that they discuss) and add to an e-portfolio.

Participants will share ideas in a respectful way where we appreciate each other's contributions.

The deadline for each week's activities is **Monday** of the following week.
