Draft of Committees members distributed in the meeting.

- IARCH Search (Zimmer) Linda shared information about TTF search with a Nov. 6 deadline and asked for ARCH faculty to circulate the description. Focus is on fabrication – furniture, digital methods, other scales. Faculty asked questions about qualifications and process. How to respond to the questions about last year's search? Due to restructuring, we are looking for another kind of person.

- Director of Graduate Studies (Elzeyadi) Newly appointed DGS. Spoke to his vision for the role of going back to the mission and working with faculty. Engage faculty students and staff in forums to plan how to make grad program stronger.
 - 1. Strengthen offerings: clusters of excellence (i.e. housing. Should shape hiring)
 - 2. Strengthen Grad Experience: research, internship, connection to profession and international
 - 3. Communicate our strengths, boost course offerings for recruitment
- Faculty Personnel Committee: (Williams) Need one more faculty to join the FPC. More policy
 work to do surrounding reviews. Still need one more full professor for fall term. Alison Kwok's
 term is completed (inaccurate information on previous document). Fifield has a conflict of
 interest and Davis asked to be excused. Daisy collected votes from EUG faculty and <u>Jim Tice</u> was
 voted on the committee.
- Ad Hoc Committee: Corner, Gillem and Rowell remain on committee. Donofrio, Davis, Elzeyadi, and Fifield withdrew. Speranza accepted nomination from Tice. *Jim Givens has accepted a nomination from Howard Davis. All TTF and Career faculty are eligible to be members so faculty have until October 10, 2018, Noon to check with other faculty or self-nominate. A vote will be conducted online due by October 17, 2018.

Discussion

 Boil down retreat input to ~4 key design research themes for centers of excellence (Moore). See brainstorming results in <u>Faculty Retreat Notes</u> and other meeting documentation at <u>http://blogs.uoregon.edu/archfaculty</u>

Report out:

VDW, Moore and Brown; Goal of creating areas of specialization, what's the difference between a specialization, certificate, institute, lab? Consider, "What are we trying to accomplish?" Sustainability and health as drivers. Consider how the built environment plays into critical questions such as economic resilience, climate change, housing, social justice, obesity.

Speranza, Williams and Fifield: Merge ideas from retreat and areas of specialization. Mission statement first? Sustainable Communities and building science integration. Start by bringing people together around coffee.

Donofrio, Davis, and Duff: Sustainability, healthy environments, healthy buildings, buildings that enhance lives, and real buildings for real people. The richness comes across in the individual work that people are doing. Be careful of diluting impact through categories. How can we characterize the work in a powerful, interesting way, without losing the individual strengths?

Rockcastle, Neis, Elzeyadi, and Tice: Design excellence at the Center. Scales of human, building, and urban. intermix themes of Community, Wellbeing and Environment. Look at larger picture and how the work SAE Faculty and students do affect the culture. Also discussed the danger of specializations marginalizing certain specialties. Sustainability plus....: how to we go deeper, and have regenerative design.

Muller and Cheng: 'Get Real: things are changing. Addressing critical issues with interdisciplinary collaboration. Addressing real problems in real places for real people. Real materials, Real challenges, Real settings. Design website so students and others can see direct correlation of how ARCH is approaching critical issues.
