What are the commonalities and differences across this large and diverse racial group, and how have Asian American communities defined themselves and their histories outside of mainstream racial narratives and stereotypes? This course examines these questions by exploring histories of Asians in America with a critical eye toward race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, citizenship, and class. It invites students to explore local histories of Asian Americans in the Pacific Northwest to engage with themes of imperialism, exclusion, war, labor, and family.
