

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON Physical Chemistry Faculty Position. The Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry (<http://chemistry.uoregon.edu>) invites applications for a tenure-related position in experimental physical chemistry (broadly defined) beginning Fall 2017 at the anticipated rank of assistant professor. Exceptional candidates in theoretical chemistry or at advanced ranks may also be considered. A PhD is required and postdoctoral experience is preferred.

The potential for establishing a vigorous independent research program in physical chemistry and active participation and excellence in teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels will be the most important criteria for selection. Candidates will also be evaluated on their ability to complement the existing physical chemistry program at the University of Oregon. Candidates who promote and enhance diversity are strongly desired. In addition to membership in the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, the successful candidate will have the opportunity to pursue research in a variety of interdisciplinary institutes (see <http://chemistry.uoregon.edu/research.html?institutes>).
