Assessment of Goals:

This project allowed me to work with both InDesign and Photoshop. As of now, I feel like I have a good handle on both programs. In Photoshop, I was able to figure out how to manipulate file sizes and colors, and I learned how to batch photos (although I did not choose to use this method in the end). In InDesign, I practiced my skills with various tricks, like setting up styles for paragraphs. I also learned all about interactive elements in PDFs. My guidebook has a few types of buttons, including rollover and tap. What I could not accomplish was creating an infographic due to time. Hopefully, though, my information is laid out nicely. There are a few pages that I'm not happy about, but I think most of it looks fairly presentable.

When I realized I probably couldn't do everything I wanted to do, I narrowed my design scope quite a bit. I referenced a couple of Oregon travel books and loved how they were laid out, but I knew that I wouldn't have the time to fill that much space. I tried to make my book look clean, and I used pictures that were taken by family, friends, and myself, so it feels more personal. As far as the interactive elements go, I kept things straightforward: I used rollovers to caption pictures and taps to jump around the information. As you know, I really wanted to incorporate the swipe aspect with pictures, but my version of Adobe is too old for that.
