I will most likely be using one of these layouts since I have already purchased them in the bundle. One of the templates included was one called London that seems to fit the criteria that I would like it to. It is supported on multiple web browsers, and seems somewhat highly rated. However, I have no idea how customizable it actually is.

Organizing content has been more challenging that I would have thought it to be. I am realizing that it is more difficult for me to categorize my art into separate categories. For my prefered medium, I paint and draw. However, I have never been too good at documenting my final products. In addition, I generally gift my art away, and do not keep very much for myself. Therefore, I have dozens photos of half finished pieces, and only a handful of photos of my completed artworks. I have also decided to add a section of my travel photography in addition to my drawings and paintings.
