Resource Overview:


Language instruction is not required by law at the Elementary School level, the frequency and intensity of the program varies greatly from town to town. Even at the secondary level, frequency of instruction and beginning age of instruction can vary within school systems as well as between districts. For this reason, instead of a lesson plan which stipulates class duration and presumes the skill level of a various age group, I have chosen to create a master list.

This resource list provides one with materials and suggested activities, so that a lesson can be designed regardless of class duration, frequency or skill set of the learners. Additionally, due to the rich nature of Day of the Dead, these materials could be used and modified in any subject area. As teachers we are always short on time. I hope this helps to facilitate cross-curricular lesson design and instruction.



Chumba la Cachumba by Carlos Cotte




<u>Clatter Bash! A Day of the Dead Celebration</u> by Richard Keep




<u>Just a Minute!: A Trickster Tale and Counting Book</u> (Pura Belpre Medal Book Illustrator Awards) by Yuyi Morales




Calavera Abecedario: A Day of the Dead Alphabet Book by Jeanette Winter

Día de Muertos by WashaWasha Games

This game is simple yet addicting. Skeletons pop up in boxes, and the player must wait to see the icon for which element of the ofrenda they need flowers, pan de muerto, prayer, or tequila, and then give it to them before they go back underground. Watch for the bar at the top that fills up as you miss feeding them. It means they are "pulling your feet." Recommended for ages 12 and up. Price: FREE

Calavera Abecedario: A Day of the Dead Alphabet Book by Jeanette Winter This app is a riff on the interactive storybook genre. It lets you record yourself reading the story of Don Pedro Linares, a famous Mexican calavera maker. While the narrative is in English, the last half of the story is the abecedario with words like "candelera" and "tortillera." The illustrations are skillful, and kids will love hearing their own or parents' voices as part of the game. Recommended for ages 4 and up. Price: \$7.99

Day of the Dead Experience the Tradition by University of Notre Dame This game would make a good resource for students doing a school project about the holiday.
