Discussion Prompts for November 16th (required for our Nov 16th class discussion):

For this question, I want you to think about new goals, not just the same goals you already set for yourself (described above), although they might be related.
 - a. **Question:** Given where you are now as a student, what **new** goal(s) do you have for yourself?
