Evidence-based Observation

Evidence is...

- Observable
- Not influenced by observer's perspective
- Free of evaluative words
- No conclusions drawn

Evidence Statements may include:

Verbatim Scripting: Use of quotation marks, record of exactly what was said by teacher.

Example: "What is a spelling for /s/?"

Observed Behavior: Just the facts. No evaluation made. Example: Students seated on floor in front of chalkboard in three rows.

Numeric Information: A number and what it refers to. Example: Line 1 blending started at 9:02, Line 2 started at 9:27.

Aspect of the Environment: Statement of fact. No evaluation made.

Example: Sound/Spelling Cards are not posted in classroom.
