Final Wanton 2014 Costs

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Below is a final cost for Wanton Mechanics 2014, along with the original cost estimate. Comments follow.

- 1. Rather than just getting 30-ish pizzas from Papa Johns, we ordered about 18 pizzas from Papa Johns and 12 feet of Party Subs from Subway (from the Subway in the EMU).
- 2. The Department of Risk Management limited us to 1 pony keg of beer and 6 bottles of wine. This is the same amount we were allotted last year (I did not know this), and it actually lasted most of the night. This is why alcohol was cheaper there was only 1 keg.
- 3. We only needed 1 alcohol monitor rather than 2. This is due to the room we used, and I assume it is because there was only side of the room people could leave from, rather than opposite walls as was the case in the EMU's Fir Room.
- 4. I decided I didn't think we needed a permit form OLCC. I think Wanton would qualify as a "special event" and unless you sell alcohol, you don't need a permit. The OLCC website talks about it here: http://www.oregon.gov/olcc/LIC/pages/special_events_weddings.aspx. If we needed a liquor license, we'd need a permit, but we don't need a liquor license. Also, we did not pay for another serving license as we used servers who already had their licensing.
