Section IV.A	Clarifies that while the committee may be involved in other awards (in a consultative fashion) the procedures and criteria in the policy only apply to HDs
Section V	Removes specificity of "October" timelineRemoved specific language around "community of the State of Oregon" for nominees as someone living outside of the state may be very tied to the UO and interested in making a recommendationAdded language about "proactive" solicitations to emphasize the President's intent that the committee actively, not passively, solicit nominations
Section V.A	Non-substantive language changes for clarity and grammar

	Addition of "as necessary" to clarify that the committee is not required to seek more information if they do not feel it's necessary
Section V.B	Non-substantive language changes for clarity and grammar
Section V.C	Inclusion of University Senate in the confidential nature of this work. This was implied through the use of executive session in Section IV.D, but this further emphasizes the importance of the confidentiality for individual members
Section V.E	Threshold of passage in the University Senate changed from a vote of two-thirds to a majorityClarification that the vote is of members present
Section V.F	References to the president not receiving information about those who do not get enough votes was removed; the president is already in the loop on all individuals considered by the Senate by virtue of his/her role as chair of the HDC. Further, information about failed votes may prove informative to the president or the HDC in further deliberations.
Section V.G	Establishes a sunset on how long a nominee may sit in the "pool" to ensure routine review; includes language that if a nominee sunsets, they may be placed back in the pool pursuant to the standard processes.
Section V.H	Clarification that president selects from the pool ("candidates" didn't seem like the right word)Removes references to SBHE/OUS and their detailed procedures on timing
