## Music & Dance Faculty Meeting

#### CALL TO ORDER

Dean Foley brought the meeting to order at 3:05 pm.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Hearing no objections or corrections, the minutes for the faculty meetings of June 6, 2017, and September 19, 2017 were approved as written.

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

At the request of the dean and in free-form and rapid fashion, faculty called out all of the events happening in the near future. Some of the items called out included the Symphonic Band concert that night, a music theatre review to happen in Beall, and that the Faculty Club at the EMU was underrepresented by the SOMD (N.B.: free food).

Foley announced that at his last NASM accreditation commission meeting earlier this month he was re-elected to continue serving.

#### **UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES REPORT**

According to Mike Grose, the annual HEADs report shows a 25% increase in enrollment over Fall 2015 (an increase of 100 music majors), and believes that the revised BA/BS general music concentration degrees have been the main driver in this increase, but also helped along by the new Popular Music degree concentration.

The Undergraduate Committee is drafting a non-music major scholarship policy that would allow for funds to support select non-majors to perform in specific large ensembles. There will be 17 scholarships of \$600 each, which meets current Oregon resident tuition and fee costs plus 20%. Each scholarship award is renewable quarter by quarter for up to one academic year; the student must maintain at least a B grade average and good standing in the ensemble.

Music Industry Collective (MIC) was created in 2016 by a soon-to-graduate business student who wanted to see it continue past his graduation. Grace Ho, Toby Koenigsberg, and Larry Wayte met with the business college and came away with some very positive conversation.

The university's Finish in Four program has an aim of helping students finish their undergraduate degree in four years. They have an early warning program that will assist students before they get too far in trouble. Grose said he would like to reintroduce the idea of an exit interview.

Finally, the undergraduate office recently sent out information about the proper use of "I" grades. The "Y" grade is no longer available as it was retired after being created during the Vietnam War as an option for students who were shipped out on very short notice and had no option to drop classes or disenroll.

### **GRADUATE STUDIES REPORT**

Straka reminded everyone that at the graduate level, an incomplete (I) grade does not change to an "F" but stays as an "I." If a student, however, accumulates more than three "I"s, the student is flagged for an academic review.

Straka reported that Grace Ho is an absolutely fabulous adviser, but that she really wants faculty to advise their students.

Recent professional development workshops have been great and popular. The graduate office has a limited budget for speakers. If you have ideas, please speak with Grace.

Discussion items currently before the Graduate Committee include how to fix the problem of students who don't pass the GRE. Master's oral exams for performance students show a great disparity across the school and the committee will seek information and offer feedback.

#### **BUSINESS AND FINANCIAL ISSUES**

The Faculty Advisory Committee had two important projects this fall:

- Division of Inclusion/Equity asked for some changes in the SOMD diversity plan.
- Reviewing 70 annual reports, assessing everyone's reports for the purposes of annual and merit reviews.

Foley has submitted merit recommendations. All continuing faculty who completed annual reports and received a rating of at least "meets expectations" will receive a merit increase. Our six new faculty were not eligible for merit but will receive 0.75% COLA increase. All raises will be effective January 1, 2018.

#### **AUDITION/ADMISSIONS REPORT**

- 106 students are receiving SOMD scholarships
- \$930,100 in student support funds were allocated for 2017–18
- 73 GEs
- 1 promising scholar

Ponto went through the deadlines that are outlined on handout (attached). He explained that the timeline is not to be oppressive, but to be helpful. Decision deadline for graduate students is the tightest turnaround of all the timelines.

Reminder: scholarship decisions will be made March 12-14; optional faculty meetings to refine scholarship offers for studio/areas will be available. In practice, we offer 140% to 150% because we never have 100% acceptance of scholarship offers.

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GE supervisors: Ponto is working at getting at least one evaluation during winter term for each GE.

## Student Deadlines:

- Sunday, December 10, 2017: Graduate applications, pre-screen recordings, and GE applications due (grace period until Monday, December 11)
- Monday, January 15, 2018: Undergraduate applications due
- Thursday, February 15: Current UO students notify SOMD Undergraduate Office if they are planning to study abroad during any part of 2018-19.
- Sunday, April 15, 2018: Graduate Decision Day (grace period until Monday, April 16)
- Tuesday, May 1, 2018: Undergraduate Decision Day

## Auditions (winter):

- Friday, February 2, 2018 (deadline to submit recorded auditions/portfolios)
- Saturday, February 3, 2018
- Saturday, February 10, 2018
- Saturday, February 24, 2018

Faculty Decision Submission Deadlines: (Decisions can be submitted earlier than listed deadlines.)


