Re: Proposed changes to BA Music – History and Literature degree

The musicology area proposes the following changes to the BA – History and Literature degree, as itemized in the enclosed checklist draft. Adapting and revising our degree to the framework of the BA – General Music degree, our main proposed changes aim to: (1) rename the degree to reflect the current state of the discipline and faculty interests; (2) create a more robust structure for undergraduate musicological studies, including addressing longstanding issues of inclusion and equity in the History and Literature curriculum by elevating the centrality of non-canonical musical traditions; (3) reorganize the ensemble requirement; and (4) provide a more flexible senior research project experience.

**Degree program affected:** BA Music – History and Literature

### Summary of proposed changes

- 1. Rename the degree: **History and Culture**. The revised title aligns our degree more closely with the cultural and social perspectives that are essential to musicological discourse in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.
  - Current degree title: BA Music History and Literature
- 2. Reorganize musicology requirements into a revised **History and Culture menu**: Students will complete a three-course music history sequence, either from the Western art-music tradition (MUS 267-9) *or* US popular music (MUS 263-5). They must take at least one course from the other sequence as well, along with Intro to Ethnomusicology (MUS 451). Additionally, students will select one additional 4-credit course from an updated History and Culture course menu, including upper division credits necessary to reach 24 total upper division credits in music. By placing popular music history on equal grounds as Western art music history and elevating ethnomusicological study, we aim to expand students' exposure to a broad range of musical traditions. The total major-specific credit requirement is 24 credits (six 4-credit classes).
  - Current music history requirement in BA Music General Music: One sequence course (MUS 267, 268, or 269), 12 other credits from a menu of musicology and ethnomusicology courses, plus 4 credits of electives from History and Culture or

Musicianship core menus. Students are also required to take at least 12 additional credits in music (MUE, MUJ, MUP, or MUS). The total major-specific credit requirement is 28 credits (seven 4-credit classes), though 12 of these credits may be outside the musicology area.

- 3. Expand ensemble requirements to six terms of *any* UO SOMD performance ensembles, including dance ensembles (not just the approved ensembles list). We will encourage students to take at least one term of an ensemble performing non-canonical repertories and provide a menu of options, though this is not a degree requirement.
  - Current ensemble requirement: Six terms of an approved large ensemble.
- 4. All majors must compile a portfolio of completed work for approval by at least two area faculty members. Submission of the portfolio must coincide with or follow one term of MUS 499 (Senior Project). The portfolio should contain the equivalent of four pieces of completed work, roughly equivalent to 45 pages of material, unified through a statement of purpose. These may be a combination of polished term papers, recorded lecture-performances, blogs/websites, other media for public consumption, or simply a thesis. Students should be in consultation with their MUS 499 instructor to ensure that the portfolio meets the standard of quality required for the major. The aim of the new senior portfolio is to better prepare majors for graduate study in musicology or another discipline.
  - Current senior project requirement (BA Music History and Literature): Two terms of junior/senior colloquium (MUS 405, which has not been active for a number of years) and two terms of senior project (MUS 499) aimed at the generation of a single thesis paper or project.

### Impact on student enrollment and retention

We anticipate that the retitling and reorganization of degree requirements will increase the visibility and attractiveness of our degree and bring our project into closer alignment with the current state of the discipline by more explicitly foregrounding the cultural aspects of music historical study. Moreover, the senior portfolio provides a more flexible and dynamic structure for research development and mentorship.

**Expected impact on other programs** 

There is the possibility that opening the ensemble requirements to all SOMD ensembles (including dance ensembles such as Dema African Ensemble) will reduce participation of History and Culture majors in the large ensembles. Given the small number of majors in our program, however, we do not anticipate that this change will significantly affect enrollment in large ensembles.

# **Establishing Satisfactory Progress in the Concentration:**

To establish that satisfactory progress is being made in the History and Culture concentration of the Music major, students must successfully complete the following coursework with a grade of C or better in the required courses. In anticipation of their senior portfolio, students should identify at least one completed final course project that might form part of this portfolio before their senior year. For questions about your progress through the concentration, please see the undergraduate music advisor.

#### II. UO Core Education

All Bachelor of Arts students must complete two writing courses and a Cultural Literacy requirement comprised of one course from Global Perspectives (GP) and one course from US: Difference, Inequality, Agency (US). They must also complete fifteen credits in each of three Areas of Inquiry: Arts and Letters, Science, and Social Science. One of the Arts and Letters courses must be in the Department of the History of Art and Architecture (ARH) or related arts field (e.g., Cinema Studies) with advisor's approval. For a list of approved courses, visit classes.uoregon.edu. Each Area of Inquiry must have at least one course in a different subject code. You may only use three courses total in the same subject code across all three Areas of Inquiry.

## Foreign Language Requirement:

For students whose native language is not English: This requirement may be met by satisfactory completion of WR 121 and either WR 122 or 123. Students must provide an official high school or college transcript as evidence of previous formal education in a foreign language. See the Registrar's Office for clearance.
