#### Call to Order

Dean Sabrina Madison-Cannon welcomes faculty and staff the SOMD meeting and calls the meeting to order at 3:05 p.m.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

#### Admissions Update from Julie Koch, Assistant Dean

- Application numbers:
  - o Current completed apps: 4 grad and 59 undergrad
  - In progress: 81 grad in process and 141 undergrad
- We are still early in the process but this is in line with what we have this time of the year in the process. Numbers typically jump over the holidays/winter break.
- If you have students working on apps, please encourage them to submit.
- New slate system for applications. Julie is happy to help and train you on the system. Reach out to her anytime; she's here to support you learning this new program.
- Functionality is same as GradWeb; all videos, media, and letters of rec will be in Slate
- Decisions are still done offline in the same process, fillable PDF form
- One thing to note: Slate will not send you a notice when you receive a new application.

#### Committee for Equity and Inclusion (CEI) Update

Alyssa Hinojosa and Kathie Hsieh present updates on behalf of CEI. Hinojosa shares that there are two events coming up to provide community with school November 17 and November 30. One event will take

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place in the music building and one in the dance building. There will be ice breakers, treats, and time to come together

Hsieh shares information about a new mini-grant program kicking off this year. This funding is available for both faculty and staff to be used for research, creative activities, etc. Proposal call coming out soon with more details and instructions. Proposals will be due in January.
