

# **Mission and Purpose**

University Housing 2020-21 assumes we will continue to operate to support the primary mission of the University of Oregon and support student success.

### Fall 2020 Readiness Plan

As part of the comprehensive university readiness plan residence halls/communities and dining facilities will follow specific guidelines to ensure:

- 1. Maximize prevention efforts
- 2. Adequate isolation and containment
- 3. Care



## **Room Types**

# Shared housing is considered a living unit for isolation and quarantine

- Mostly double rooms
- Some single rooms
- A minimum of 64 square feet ensured for each resident
- Some rooms have private bathrooms, some shared

### **Room Details**

- Typical furniture configured to maximize separation between residents in a shared room where feasible
- Ventilation provided through operable windows;
   residence halls do not have central ventilation
- Daily cleaning and surface disinfecting inside residence hall rooms is done by residents; cleaning supplies including EPA-registered disinfectant provided



### **Community bathrooms**

- Deep cleaned and sanitized daily by custodial service and additional daily general cleaning along with sanitizing of touch points using EPA-registered disinfectants
- Cleaning by students as they use restrooms is highly encouraged before and after use; EPA-registered disinfectants will be provided
- Touchless soap and paper towel dispensers provided

#### **Ensuite bathrooms**

- Shared by one room (single or double occupancy)
- Daily cleaning and surface disinfectant is done by residents;
   EPA-registered disinfectants will be provided
- Housing custodial staff will inspect and clean quarterly



#### **Public bathrooms**

- Located near dining, academic residential community areas, and other areas generally open to the public and guests
- Cleaned and sanitized daily by housing custodial staff; twice-daily sanitizing of touch points using EPA-registered disinfectants
- Self-service sanitizing by restroom users before and after use is encouraged; paper towels from touchless dispensers and EPAregistered disinfectants are provided
- Touchless soap and paper towel dispensers and air hand dryers are provided; use of paper towels to handle common touch points is encouraged

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# **Incident Case Management**

# Student is identified through the University Health Center (UHC) as a case requiring isolation or quarantine

- Student is assigned to a quarantine or isolation space
- Student will receive meals delivered outside their door (three times daily)
- Student may leave only when UHC provides instruction



## **Isolation, Containment, and Care**

- Housing is designating approximately 4 percent of its rooms for isolation and self-quarantine.
- Depending on circumstances, a floor may isolate in place
- Isolation procedures will be coordinated between the University Health Center, Incident Management Team members, Lane County Public Health, and University Housing
- University dining will implement detailed food delivery protocols. Food will be delivered on a regular basis in a way that requires no contact between delivery person and resident in quarantine or isolation room
- Custodial staff will use appropriate PPE when cleaning quarantine and isolation spaces
- Residence life staff will provide appropriate community care and programming remotely



- All dining venues are continuously cleaned and disinfected throughout the day by a dedicated team
- Strict sanitation practices for all areas to keep things clean, sanitized, and safe. We are following all recommended CDC and Lane County Health Department protocols for food businesses
- Hand sanitizer available
- Cleaning and sanitation of tables and chairs between guests with signage system to indicate tables are clean and ready for use



- All dining staff and guests are required to wear face coverings at all times (except while eating)
- Guest areas have social distancing cues and signs to help maintain six-foot distancing
- Reduced seating capacity—maximum of two people seated together with six-foot distancing between groups



### Signage and postings

- Promote the use of face coverings
- Promote six-foot social distancing in all lounges, kitchens, lobbies, laundry rooms, and elevators (signs and floor stickers)
- Promote handwashing
- Arrange or remove furniture to promote social distancing
- Laundry washing instructions

### Cleaning

- Clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces regularly
- Include sanitizing stations outside of lounges and/or in the lobby
- Signage and increased cleaning for community kitchens

# **Student Expectations**

- Wear face coverings while in public spaces
- Keep six feet (about two arms' length) from other people
- Monitor their health, seek medical attention as appropriate, and stay in their residence hall rooms if they feel ill
- Handwashing hygiene
- Cover coughs and sneezes

### **Residential Education**

- Include social distancing guidelines that align with university social distancing guidelines in University Housing community standards
- Community meetings and programs restricted to number of people according to guidelines; if six-foot distance can't be maintained, meeting will be virtual
